But the reason I was looking in the first place is because I was trying to get confirmation about yet another topic – money. I'm sure you've heard that Jesus talked about money more than any other subject or if not just Jesus, the Bible talks about money more than any other subject. I even found a couple of websites where someones or somewheres counted the times it occurs. One even gave the word counts for other subjects as well: "believe" is used 272 times, "pray" is used 371

times, "love" is mentioned 714 times and money is referenced 2162 times.

Then I thought to myself, "Self," I said, "the verses in Philippians aren't really talking about money but about being generous." And generousness

**IS** one of the most talked about subjects in the Bible. And since God spoke on the subject, we ought to as well – possibly more than we do. So, I want to spend a small bit of time writing about generosity. In verses 15 and 16 Paul says, "15 Now you Philippians know also that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no church shared with me concerning giving and receiving but you only. 16 For even in Thessalonica you sent aid once and again for my necessities." And then Paul has a lovely phrase to describe their generosity: "a sweet-smelling aroma, an acceptable sacrifice, well pleasing to God" (v.18c). I'm fairly certain that some of you, when you get home from church today will be greeted at the door by a fragrant smell - a nice roast beef, a wonderful ham, a delicious casserole. It'll smell rich and good and inviting, and guess what? That's how God sees (or smells?) generous Christians. I wonder what we *DO* smell like to Him?

Now, I want you to up front that I'm not after

anyone's money. I believe this is one of the most giving little congregations ever. Nor am I after your time or talents because I know some folks might say, "I give my time rather than money." And that's GREAT! But when Jesus talks about giving in the Bible He doesn't see it in terms of either one or the other. Instead, He calls us to be generous with everything we have for His sake. There are more promises in the Bible about *GIV-ING* than any other subject and of course, the biggest Giver in the Bible is God, who "so loved

the world the He gave his only Son that we may not perish but have eternal life." God is the Chief Giver and if we want to be like Him, we need to be generous too.

Besides simply being generous because God asks it of

us, are there any benefits of generosity?

- 1. Generosity draws our heart closer to God's heart. Jesus said that "where your treasure is, there is your heart also" (Matthew 6:21). He's saying that what we do with our money shows our priorities. If we put our money in our house, that's where our heart is. If we put our money into eating out, that's where our heart is. If we put our money into clothes, into a hobby, into politics, into anything but Him, that shows exactly where our heart is! That then begs the question, where is your heart? Or perhaps a better question is where do you want your heart to be? Because every time we're generous, we are moving our heart in a Godward direction we're drawing closer to Him.
- 2. Generosity strengthens our faith. The Bible is full of promises that God will provide for us, but a lot of those promises depend upon us being generous too. Jesus told us to "give and it will be [continued on page 6]

given to you. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you" (Luke 6:38). God is saying, in effect, "I *DARE* you to try trusting me! The more generous you are to Me, the more generous I will be to you!" So when we give, when we're generous, it's not just a financial thing — it's a faith thing — we're giving, trusting that God will provide. And the more we do that, the stronger our faith grows.

3. Generosity is an investment in eternity. We've all head the phrase, "You can't take it with you." The Christian version of that would add, "but you can send it ahead!" And that's exactly what Jesus taught when he talked about storing up treasure in Heaven rather than on Earth. So, how do we store up treasure in Heaven? We do it by generously investing in people who are going there — just like those generous Philippians did.

Back in 1903, James Kraft invented Philadelphia Cream Cheese. And his company, Kraft Cheese, has gone from strength to strength ever since, making him and his descendants fabulously wealthy. What's striking about the company's founder was his attitude to investment, he said, "The only investment I ever made which has paid consistently increasing dividends is the money I have given to the Lord." When we're generous with the money God has given us, it's an investment in eternity. Apparently James Kraft gave 25% of his income to Christian work. Given what he was earning, he could afford to give that much. But what about us? How much should we give?

#### SCRIPTURE VERSES FROM PHILIPPIANS

1:21-26 – <sup>21</sup> For to me, to live is Christ, and to die is gain. <sup>22</sup> But if I live on in the flesh, this will mean fruit from my labor; yet what I shall choose I cannot tell. <sup>23</sup> For I am hard-pressed between the two, having a desire to depart and be with Christ, which is far better. <sup>24</sup> Nevertheless to remain in the flesh is more needful for you. <sup>25</sup> And being confident of this, I know that I shall remain and continue with you all for your progress and joy of faith, <sup>26</sup> that your rejoicing for me may be more abundant in Jesus Christ by my coming to you again.

2:3-4 — <sup>3</sup> Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. <sup>4</sup> Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others.

3:12-14 — <sup>12</sup> Not that I have already attained, or am already perfected; but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me. <sup>13</sup> Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, <sup>14</sup> I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

4:4-7 — <sup>4</sup> Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice! <sup>5</sup> Let your gentleness be known to all men. The Lord is at hand. <sup>6</sup> Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; <sup>7</sup> and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

 $4:12-13 - {}^{12}I$  know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need.  ${}^{13}I$  can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.
