PROMISES, PROMISES

The world paints a distorted picture of sin. It is glorified. It is glamorized. It glitters with the bling of worldly wisdom but delivers nothing by way of substance. It glows with a warmth straight from the devil's hell. Because sin's consequences are unlike its promises, it would be wise to know something about what sin actually does for us.

In the first place, sin separates us from God. Isaiah reminded his readers that "the Lord's hand is not so short that it cannot save; neither is His ear so dull that it cannot hear. But your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God, and your sins have hidden His face from you, so that He does not hear" (Is. 59:1-2). Sin separates from God. The apostle Paul reminded the Ephesians that prior to their conversion, they were separate from Christ (Eph. 2:12). When severed from Christ, there is no opportunity for spiritual life. Sin separates us from the source of all life.

In the second place, not only does sin separate; it also enslaves. Just as sinful habits can enslave the body, so also sin enslaves the soul. Jesus

says, "everyone who commits sin is the slave of sin" (Jn. 8:34). Paul says that we "are slaves of the one whom we obey, either of sin resulting in death, or of obedience resulting in righteousness" (Rm. 6:16). Sin separates and enslaves.

Finally, sin kills us. Listen carefully to

Paul's statement in Romans 6:23 where he writes, "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Although physical death is the result of sin having been brought into the world, in this passage, Paul is talking about spiritual and eternal death. In order to be cleansed from sin and escape its sen-

tence of death so as to enjoy paradise with God, we must take advantage of the benefits of Christ's blood. The author of the book of Revelation writes: "Blessed are those who wash their robes,

so that they may have the right to the tree of life, and may enter by the gates into the city" (Rev. 22:14). Earlier in the book, it is revealed that their robes had been washed and made white in the blood of the Lamb (Rev. 7:14).

So, what does sin do for us? It separates us from God, our source

of life and blessing. It hopelessly enslaves us to our own passions and desires. And, finally, if untreated, sin kills us spiritually and eternally. All of this is sufficient cause for us to seek the only cure; that is, having our robes washed white in the blood of the Lamb.

Sin carries tragic consequences. It separates us from God. It enslaves us to our own passions and desires. And, it eventually destroys our soul. Shifting gears from the negative, consider how the blood of Christ remedies the problem of sin.

In the first place, while sin separates us from God, the blood of Jesus brings about reconciliation. In Romans 5:10, Paul writes, "For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life." We are reconciled to God through the death of His Son. Again, in Ephesians 2:13, Paul says, "But now in Christ Jesus you who formerly were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ." The good news is that we can be brought back into the favor and friendship of God through the blood of Jesus.

Another way the blood of Jesus remedies the problem of sin is through the process of redemption. "Redeem" means "to buy back." So, while sin enslaves the soul, the blood of Jesus purchases redemption and sets us free. Peter tells us that we "were not redeemed with perishable things like [continued on page 6]

On arriving there, they went to the <u>Jewish synagogue</u>. ¹¹ Now the <u>Berean Jews</u> were of <u>more noble character</u> than those in <u>Thessalonica</u>, for they <u>received</u> the <u>message</u> with <u>great eagerness</u> and <u>examined</u> the <u>Scriptures every day</u> to see if what <u>Paul</u> said was <u>true</u>. ¹² As a <u>result</u>, <u>many</u> of them <u>believed</u>, as did also a <u>number</u> of <u>prominent</u> <u>Greek women</u> and many Greek <u>men</u>.





silver or gold from your futile way of life inherited from your forefathers, but with precious blood, as of a lamb unblemished and spotless, the blood of Christ" (1 Pet. 1:18-19). Sin enslaves — it captivates the soul. But Jesus paid the ransom for sin, setting us free through the offering of His life's blood on the cross of Calvary.

Finally, the third way that the blood of Jesus remedies the problem of sin is that, while sin kills and destroys, the blood of Iesus gives spiritual life. Paul opens the second chapter of his letter to the Ephesians reminding them that they had been dead in their sins. Then, beginning in verse four, he draws a contrast between where they had been and where they were now in Christ. He says, "But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ..." (Eph. 2:4-5). A similar contrast is drawn in 1 Corinthians 15:22 where Paul writes, "For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ all shall be made alive." Truly, life is in the blood and, spiritually speaking, spiritual life is in the blood of our Savior Jesus Christ.

The blood of Jesus is the perfect cleansing agent for the problem of sin. It removes completely the effects and stain of sin in the human heart. If we hope to be saved from our sins, we must be washed in the blood of Jesus.

¹⁹ Now those who had been scattered by the persecution that broke out when Stephen was killed traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus and Antioch, spreading the word only among Jews. 20 Some of them, however, men from Cyprus and Cyrene, went to Antioch and began to speak to Greeks also, telling them the good news about the Lord Jesus. 21 The Lord's hand was with them, and a great number of people believed and turned to the Lord. 22 News of this reached the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. 23 When he arrived and saw what the grace of God had done, he was glad and encouraged them all to remain true to the Lord with all their hearts. ²⁴ He was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and faith, and a great number of people were brought to the Lord. 25 Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, ²⁶ and when he found him, he brought him to Antioch. So for a whole year Barnabas and Saul met with the church and taught great numbers of people. The disciples were called Christians first at Antioch.
